

CHAPTER ACTIVITIES/ INFORMATION

The Dutch SISPE serves as a network between pharmacoepidemiology students to facilitate cooperation, showcase research, and share knowledge. We hope to connect pharmacoepidemiology students and research institutions in the Netherlands to each other, build bridges to their counterparts in Europe, and ultimately facilitate connections worldwide.

During the past year, we have sent bi-monthly information email/ newsletter to the chapter members, to get them informed and engaged with relevant events and news in the field of pharmacoepidemiology, such as the career workshop event hosted by the ISPE Student Council and the Real World Evidence Proposal Competition. The members of the Dutch ISPE have also formed a team to join the competition!

We have also expanded our educational activities within our Dutch ISPE Student Chapter by inviting Dutch student chapter members to the monthly method discussion sessions at Utrecht University. The topics of the recent sessions include Estimands in observational pharmacoepidemiologic comparative effectiveness and safety studies, Guidance on the use of RWE in drug regulatory decision making, and Data Mining in R.

CHAPTER NEWS/ UPDATES

In early 2024, the number of members in our student chapter reached 40, spanning over 10 universities in the Netherlands and Belgium. • Showcase for 2023 presentation.

We created a website to highlight the presentations from our institute that were accepted for the ICPE event in 2023. You can find the QR code on the right. We also added this QR code to our posters and distributed name cards to attendees, inviting them to explore our research and share their feedback on the website. These initiatives boosted our visibility and led to more frequent interactions with international participants.



Invited talk with International Scholars

This semester, we invited renowned epidemiologists from Taiwan to share their past research experiences with us. Joshua Lin from Harvard University discussed how to use High-Dimensional Proxy to adjust for confounding factors in EHR and claims databases. Wan Ting Huang from SPEAC explained the application of epidemiological methods to promptly assess the safety of vaccines or drugs for unknown infectious diseases. Dr. Hui-Ju Tsai from the National Health Research Institutes shared insights on integrating genomic information with pharmacoepidemiology. Professor Pei-Chen Lee from NCKU's School of Public Health led a discussion on the similarities and differences between environmental epidemiology and pharmacoepidemiology. Through interactions with experts from various fields, we gained a broader perspective on the potential developments in our field. We learned how to combine pharmacoepidemiology with other disciplines, paving the way for potential collaborations beyond the realm of pharmaceuticals.

Increased Cohesion

In February 2024, the members of our student chapter and faculty embarked on a team-building trip to Yilan, Taiwan. Yilan is renowned for its beautiful landscapes, hot springs, and rich cultural heritage. This trip helped us to strengthen our bonds, improve teamwork, and foster a sense of unity among our members.

Presentation skill workshop

We joined the Presentation Skill Workshop focuses on understanding the key considerations behind creating effective teaching presentations using the SOIL principles (Selection, Organization, Integration, and Learning) and AMA tools (Activate Mind and Attention). We can learn the method of how to apply these techniques to enhance the teaching of pharmacoepidemiology.

General Body Meeting

We kicked off the fall semester with a general body meeting, where we introduced the functions of the International Society for PharmacoEpidemiology (ISPE) and the ISPE Student Chapter, along with our current board members. During the event, we also highlighted the ISPE Student Council Activities and Opportunities and discussed our upcoming activities for this year. This meeting set the stage for an engaging and productive year ahead.



Internship Sharing Event

During our internship-sharing event, we invited speakers who had completed internships at pharmaceutical companies and research institutions to share their experiences. We discussed when and how to start finding internships and shared insights on interview preparation and the differences between in-person and remote internships. More importantly, we provided guidance on managing workloads and learning through practical experiences during internships.



Professional Workshop-Propensity Score Weighting

In our workshop, we learned how to use the SAS program to conduct research using the Medical Expenditure Panel Survey (MEPS) dataset. Using a research topic from a published paper, we demonstrated how to use survey data to create a study cohort. This included extracting our exposure, covariates, and outcome of interest. Following this, we applied the propensity score weighting method we learned during the course to real-world data, bridging classroom knowledge with practical application.


